STEPS FOR YOUR PURE SAFE TRAVEL

PROTOCOLS FOR ENTRY INTO GRENADA

Pre-Travel Protocols

1. [COVID-19 Update on fully Vaccinated Visitors](#). You are considered **FULLY VACCINATED two weeks after your last dose of the vaccination**. Where non-vaccinated persons (*including children*) are travelling with vaccinated travellers, the entire party will be treated as un-vaccinated and subject to a minimum of seven (7) days in quarantine in the first instance. The party will be subject to PCR testing on day five (5) in quarantine. Results may take up to forty-eight (48) hours. If the results are negative, the party will be allowed to circulate among the community. If results are positive, the party will be quarantined for an additional period at the party's expense.
2. Book your flight for Grenada. Make sure you do so with enough time to complete all your pre-travel protocols for Grenada (*Travel Authorization, Quarantine Accommodations, RT-PCR Test etc.*)
3. Book [approved quarantine accommodations](#) for a MINIMUM of 7 days. (*You will need your Accommodations Confirmation and your COVID-19 Confirmation numbers from the facility to complete your Travel Authorization Application.*). **Fully vaccinated travellers**, please see recent [updated Protocols](#) for your quarantine.
4. Traveller(s) **must** meet one of the following criteria before applying for home quarantine (*application is part of the Travel Authorization form*):
 - a) If the person travelling is, or persons in the travelling party are over 65
 - b) Travelling with young children or minors in their party
 - c) Diplomats or Government Officials
 - d) Have a disability or medical condition
 - e) Any other extenuating circumstances, in the event that there is something that Health officials did not consider
 - f) Home must be inspected and deemed suitable for home quarantine (**Apply at least 7 days prior to travel**). The home **must** be un-occupied prior to traveller(s) arrival.
5. Apply for [travel authorization](#) at least one (1) week prior to your travel date (*further in advance would be better to allow the Health Authorities in Grenada to properly receive and process your application*). You **must** receive confirmation from Grenada in the form of a **Pure Safe Travel Authorization Certificate (PSTAC)** to be able to travel. The Certificate is **mandatory** for travel. 6. Get RT-PCR tested [72 hours prior to travel](#).
7. It is strongly recommended that **visitors** purchase Travel Insurance for your trip or if applicable, activate the Global Travel component of your Health Insurance with your carrier.
8. Be certain to have a hard or soft copy of your **Pure Safe Travel Authorization Certificate** AND your **negative RT-PCR** test results to show the airline at check-in. (*Your **Approved Quarantine Accommodations** will be part of your PSTAC package.*)

In-Country Protocols

9. Once you have cleared Customs and Immigration in Grenada, you will need to take an **approved airport taxi** or **tour operator transfer service** to your approved quarantine accommodations.
10. Please be guided by your approved accommodation rules and protocols.
11. A COVID-19 PCR test will be administered on or after day 5, by the Ministry of Health at a cost of **US\$150/EC\$410** to be paid online prior to travel <https://pay.gov.gd/>. Please download and keep your receipt.
12. Should you need to wear a GPS wrist tracking device for any reason while in Grenada, there is a **US\$55/EC\$150** fee which may be paid online at <https://pay.gov.gd/>. Please download and keep your receipt.
13. **After** clearance is received from Health Officials, you are permitted to leave the quarantine hotel, or to continue your stay in the "non-quarantine" section of the property. See complete details <https://covid19.gov.gd/travel-covid/>.
14. Pure Safe Travel Approved Tourism Services must be used when interacting with the public. See details <https://www.puregrenada.com/approved-tourism-services/>.
